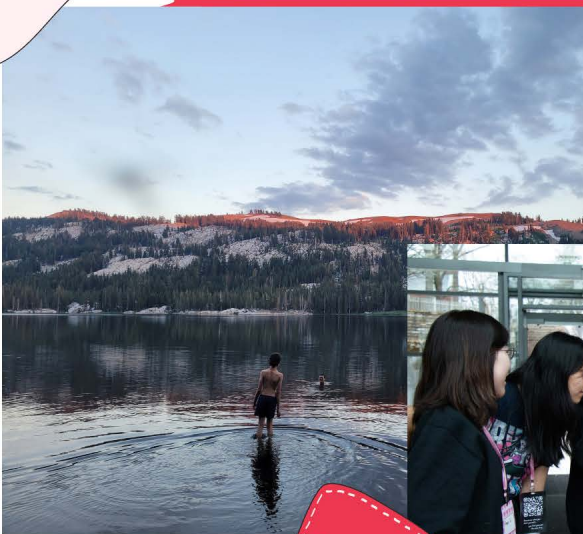

Dear Supporter,

Hack Club's motto is **by teenagers, for teenagers.**

In 2024, we saw strong growth: teenagers built and deployed nearly 6,000 technical projects, explored cybersecurity through real-world hacking experiences, and moved more than \$37 million electronically through Hack Club Bank. In total, they oversaw events reaching over 5,000 teenagers nationwide; **and collectively spent 18.5 years coding.**

We tripled the size of our full-time teen staff and made a bold, permanent commitment—Hack Club's staff will be **50% teenagers, always.** Through their leadership, teens tackled the frontiers of AI, created after-school coding clubs, organized nearly 100 live, in-person events across the country, and forged thousands of friendships.

We can't predict the future economy, but Hack Club is creating a culture and boundless community where teenagers acquire real-world, applied skills to shape it. Hack Club is a space rooted in curiosity, kindness, determination, optimism and confidence gained from mastery. This is all possible because of you.

Hack Club Bank (HCB)

A transparent financial services platform building real-life skills for teens

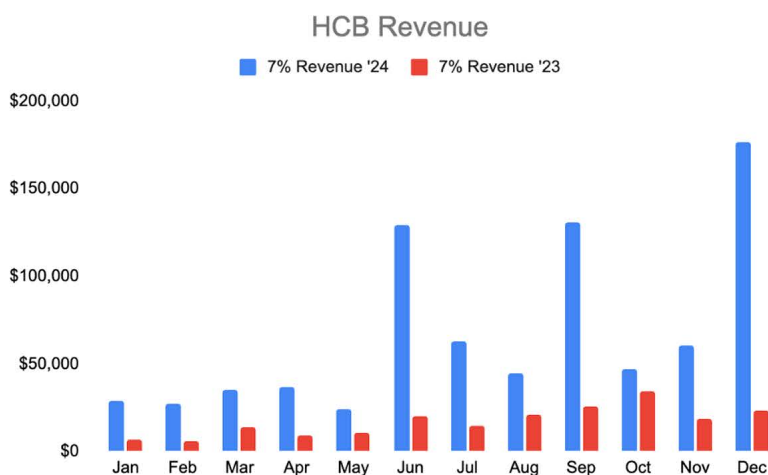

Hack Club allows teens to do real things in the real world. A financial platform built in 2018 by teenagers, HCB crossed \$37 million in transactions in 2024 — **our highest ever**. Unlike every other nonprofit, we run our finances transparently.

Founded by a teenager, Hack Club is committed to a unique staffing goal: **50% of its team is teenagers.**

Our **30 interns** and **12 gap year students**, who represent over 12 countries, have incredible autonomy to determine Hack Club's direction for other teenagers.

In 2024, they built and shipped programs for tens of thousands of other teenagers, ran events, conceptualized and created all our media, interacted with donors, oversaw travel, and managed enormous budgets.

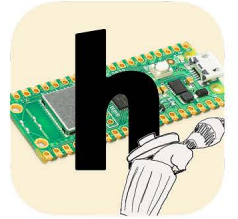

The BIN



Boba Drops is a YSWS program started in 2024. Beginner students learned foundational web development skills to deploy their very first websites.

In exchange for students shipping complete websites, Hack Club gave students free Boba Tea!

The Bin is an electronic YSWS program started in 2024. Students created their own PCB, or Personal Circuit Board.

When students submitted their finished PCB designs, Hack Club sent them beginner hardware kits for free!

Growing Impact, not Spend

Hack Club is seeing strong growth. In the last year, the number of teenagers completing technical projects at Hack Club has grown from **249** to **5,306**, while our spend has only grown from **\$4.3m** to **\$4.52m**.

Our spend grew 5.1%. Our impact grew 2,100%.

We achieve efficiency by:

- Headquartered in a small Vermont town with low rents
- Half our staff are teenagers; we keep a focused team of 25 and have no assistants or fundraising staff
- 80% of our team are engineers (problem-solving wizards)



Teenagers learn to manage money:

In 2024 teens directly managed more than \$500k to implement CS programs for other teens. Teens distributed another \$500k to other teens in technical prizes for coding in our competitions. **Through HCB, teens executed 108.539 financial transactions, moving over \$37 million.**
